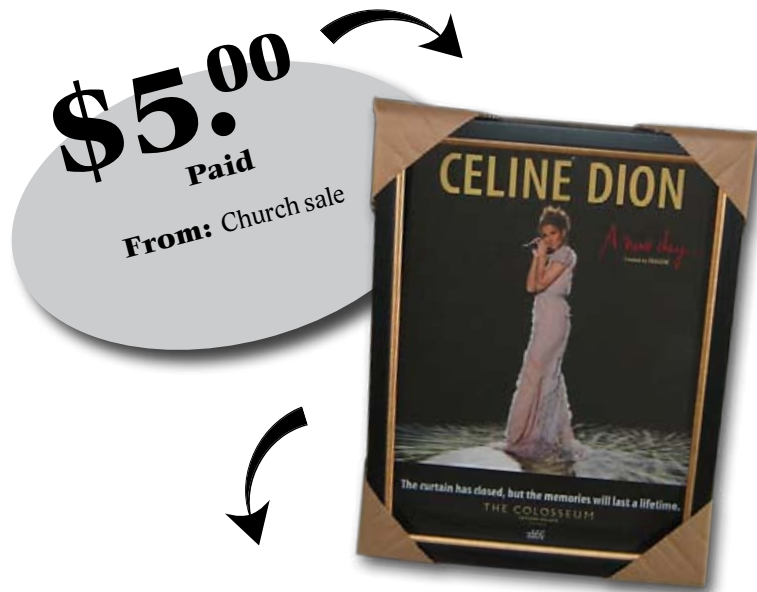

It was a hot, sticky Saturday morning in August 2008 and I was out and about garage sale-ing. I pulled up to a moving sale in an older subdivision. It was a strange sight. There was a lawn chair under a shade tree and in front of the chair 2 planks were laid on top of stacks of cinder blocks.

After looking at the offerings, I thanked the young woman sitting in the lawn chair and started to head back to my car when a large black box that was leaning against the tree trunk behind her caught my eye. I asked the girl about it. She told me that she was moving to Asia to be in a show there, and that she had previously been in Celine Dion's A New Day show at Caesars Palace, and that the item in the box had been given to her by Celine at the close of the show.

When I asked to see it, I discovered that the box had never been opened! She and I struggled to open the box that was securely closed with large industrial staples and glue. In opening the box I managed to get a small smudge of nail polish on one of the inner flaps - one that would not be immediately noticeable to anyone, thank goodness! She pulled the picture from the box -- it was beautiful and I WANTED IT (to re-sell, of course!) The young woman told me

she wanted \$100 for it, and I indicated that I couldn't afford that and offered \$50. She was firm in her price and before I reluctantly left, I wrote my name and phone number down and told her that if she changed her mind about accepting \$50, she should call me. I never heard from her.

Fast forward to late October. Mom and I were garage sale-ing with little

success late on a Saturday morning. We were enroute to our last estate sale of the day via Desert Inn when mom pointed to a parking lot on the other side of the road. It was a church parking lot and had tables full of merchandise, a couple of white canopies and a large RUMMAGE SALE sign. I turned around and we headed to the sale. Mom started at the left front of the sale, so I headed to the back. As I approached several tables of housewares, I saw a familiar looking black box leaning up against the back fence. Once I had the picture at home, I opened it up to show Bill - and to further check it out. Imagine my surprise to find it fully intact in all its original packing materials.
